• Originally entered an Ontario high school before 1999

- No prior learning assessment and recognition (PLAR) available
- Resident of Ontario

SECONDARY SCHOOL GRADUATION DIPLOMA (SSGD)

- Original high school entry between 1974-1984
- 27 credits: compulsory & optional determined at registration
- Up to 12 maturity credits

- Originally entered an Ontario high school 1999 or after
- All out-of-province adult learners
- Required for any student who wishes to access the PLAR for Mature Students **Process**
- Resident of Ontario

ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL DIPLOMA (OSSD)

- 30 credits (18 compulsory)
- a) PLAR 9/10 assessment = 16 credits
- b) PLAR 11/12 challenge or equivalency = 10 credits
- c) 4 final credits
- Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test or Ontario Secondary School Literacy Course
- 40 hours community involvement

- School Board delivery is through adult day programming, summer school, night school, correspondence or e-learning, full-time or part-time
- Independent Learning Centre delivery is predominantly e-learning with correspondence available for some courses
- **Private School** delivery is fee-based

COLLEGE **UNIVERSITY**

ACADEMIC AND CAREER ENTRANCE PROGRAM (ACE)

- 19 years or older
- Out of school
- Students with or without a secondary school diploma are eligible
- Resident of Ontario

ACE CERTIFICATE OR COURSES

- ACE certificate requirements: Communications (English/Français), Mathematics, and any 2 other ACE courses
- Students may choose to acquire the ACE certificate or to take only postsecondary prerequisite ACE courses
- ACE courses provide postsecondary prerequisites which are equivalent to secondary school credits
- 12 ACE courses include Communications, Sciences, Mathematics, Computer **Fundamentals and Self Management**
- Community College delivery is year-round, days, evenings, full-time, part-time, in-class or via e-learning

APPRENTICESHIP COLLEGE **UNIVERSITY***

GENERAL EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT (GED)

- 18 years or older
- Out of school for a year
- No secondary school diploma
- Resident of Ontario

GED

- High school equivalency certificate
- 5 tests:
 - Language Arts Writing
 - Language Arts Reading
 - Mathematics
 - Social Studies

Science

- Some postsecondary programs require additional prerequisite courses for admission
- Optional GED preparation from local adult education providers
- GED preparation manuals available in many bookstores
- GED testing through the **Independent Learning Centre**

MATURE STUDENT STATUS

- 19 years or older
- Out of school one year
- No secondary school diploma or equivalent
- Resident of Ontario

MATURE STUDENT TEST

- Not available at all colleges
- Areas tested may include English/ Français, Mathematics
- Other areas may be tested depending on college and program
- Individual colleges determine required scores
- Test used varies from college to college
- Contact individual College Registrar's Office to determine availability and process
- Unsuccessful test writers may be referred to ACE programming
- Some postsecondary programs require additional prerequisite courses for admission

- 21 years or older by December 31 in the year of application
- Not completed a postsecondary program
- Away from formal education for at least two years
- Not eligible for admission as a secondary school graduate
- Canadian citizen or permanent resident

OUAC 105D APPLICATION

- Admittance upon successful completion of secondary-level courses in the prerequisite subjects for the intended program of study
- Apply via the OUAC website (http://www.ouac.on.ca/). Mature applicants must complete an OUAC 105D application
- If the applicant attended a postsecondary institution within Ontario, there will be a request for a transcript through the OUAC 105D application
